# REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF POSTVILLE, IOWA December 12, 2022

- 1. A regular meeting of the City Council of Postville, Iowa, in the Council Chambers at 147 N. Lawler St. On December 12, 2022, beginning at 7:00 p.m. with Dennis Koenig presiding.
- 2. On call of the roll, the following Council Members were present: Rebecca Engelhardt, Mary Engstrom Ross Malcom, Devora Klein-Mahr. Absent: Larry Moore.

  \* Moore arrived at 7:33 p.m.
- 3. Council Member Malcom made a motion to approve the **agenda** as posted by the Clerk. Seconded by Engstrom. Carried 4:0. Absent:1

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all in attendance.

Citizen Comments: Crystal Duffy made comment about the Diversity Garden, Val Reinke informed the City Council about the Allamakee Façade Program and 12 applications the county received for funding with two projects being from Postville. Total County projects total \$42,836.12 with \$7,000 balance remaining of funding.

- 4. Public hearing was held on the Authorization of Loan Agreement and the issuance of Notes to evidence the obligation of the City thereunder. No citizen present made comment and no written objection was received. The hearing was closed. Council Member Engstrom made a motion to adopt **Resolution** #1374-22 a Resolution Instituting Proceeding to take Additional Action for the Issuance of not to Exceed \$400,000 Taxable General Obligation Capital Loan Notes. Seconded by Malcom. The roll was called ayes: Engelhardt, Engstrom, Malcom and Mahr. Nays: None. Absent: Moore. Carried 4:0.
- 5. Public Hearing was held on sale of property 261 W. Stoneman. No citizen present made comment and no written comments were received. The hearing was closed. Mayor Koenig informed the council no bids were received for the property. No action taken on **Resolution #1371-22** a resolution awarding bid for purchase of 261 W Stoneman Street.
- 6. **Judy Egeland** addressed the Council giving an overview of the Diversity Garden the garden gives 800 pounds of food to the food pantry each year. She expressed difficulty in moving several plants to a new location addressed concern regarding the relocation of the garden to the school and ground testing for lead paint. Currently the garden has 20 citizens utilizing it and has the school gardens at this site.
- 7. Public Hearing was held on the sale of Diversity Garden property. Citizen Christina Mueller made comment that the move maybe could be delayed to allow another season to transition to the school grounds. Jim Seibert asked why the City is selling the property. Mary Koopman commented on the Food and Fitness grants and the garden being a unique place. No written comments were received. The hearing was closed. Mayor Koenig opened one sealed bid received from Bacon Concrete in the amount of \$25,000. \* Council Member Moore arrived 7:33 p.m. Council Member Malcom made a motion to adopt **Resolution #1372-22** A Resolution Awarding bid for Purchase of Diversity Garden W Stoneman St. Seconded by Mahr. The roll was called Ayes: None. Nays: Engelhardt, Engstrom, Malcom, Mahr and Moore. Failed 5:0. Council Member Moore made comment that more details are needed to be worked out.
- 8. Kristy Turner, Postville Child Care Director addressed the Council regarding **child care** trends in Allamakee and Clayton County. With staffing issues at the center, the number of children currently served are 46 with a license capacity of 80 the center has reduced hours due to the staff shortfall. Turner spoke of business grants that would be a two- year commitment of a business to give a benefit to the employees of childcare. Turner spoke how she was against raising rates to parents in efforts to offer a higher wage and benefit package and the need to be able to draw more job applicants to the center which results in a \$177,000 deficit. Turner requested someone from the City be part of a child care task force.
- 9. Randy Plaht, **Postville Fire Department** spoke on behalf of the truck committee according to Plaht the department is looking to replace the 89' rescue van, jaws and 95' pumper truck with all into one truck of a rescue. pumper, and van. The department has sent out bids to Toyne with cost of the new unit \$465K Plaht spoke about the 1995 pumper piping being rotten. He asked what funding the city had in CDs for truck replacement. Plaht stated that all organizations would need to get on the same page for the purchase.
- 10. Public Hearing was held on the **Budget Amendment FY 22/23** no written or oral comments were received. The hearing was closed. Council Member Engelhardt made a motion to adopt Resolution #1373-22 a Resolution Adopting the Budget Amendment #1 for Fiscal Year 2022-2023. Seconded by Moore. The roll was called ayes: Engelhardt, Engstrom, Malcom, Mahr and Moore. Nays: None. Carried 5:0.
- 11. Council Member Malcom made a motion to adopt **Resolution #1370-22** A Resolution to Transfer Funds. Seconded by Moore. The roll was called ayes: Engelhardt, Engstrom, Malcom, Mahr and Moore. Nays: None. Carried 5:0.

- 12. Michelle Barness, UERPC and Corey Snitker Allamakee Co Emergency Management were present to go over the **Hazard Mitigation Planning** for the County. The City Council reviewed and discussed the Community profile information for Postville, discussion of hazards most relevant to the community and mitigation actions for inclusion in the new plan.
