REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF POSTVILLE, IOWA March 11, 2024

- 1. A regular meeting of the City Council of Postville, Iowa, in the Council Chambers at 147 N. Lawler St. on March 11, 2024, beginning at 7:00 p.m. with Dennis Koenig presiding.
- 2. On call of the roll, the following Council Members were present: Larry Moore, Devora Klein-Mahr, Laurie Moody, Mary Engstrom and Rebecca Engelhardt. Absent: None.
- 3. Council Member Engstrom made a motion to approve the **agenda** as posted by the Clerk. Seconded by Engelhardt. Carried 5:0.
 - The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all in attendance.
- 4. Tara Hoffert, Community Insurance informed the Council of the upcoming ICAP property **insurance renewal** and the changes the market is seeing with coverage. The City should anticipate a 30% increase in the renewal and there is now an endorsement on policies cosmetic exclusion and catastrophic loss modifications. The renewal will be ready for review at the May 2024 meeting.
- 5. Council Member Engstrom made a motion to adopt **Resolution #1420-24**, A Resolution Approving the Subdivision Plat to Allamakee County, Iowa (Ziegler, Postville LLC) Seconded by Moody. The roll was called ayes: Moore, Mahr, Moody, Engstrom and Engelhardt. Nays: None. Carried 5:0.
- 6. Aaron Schimmel, was present on behalf of Gideon Gratsiani requesting closure of the State highway for a **Torah Parade** on Sunday March 17, 2024. The request was to close the State Highway from the Southern Comfort Subdivision to 100th Street the parade would be from Mr. Gratsiani home to the Shul starting at 3:30 p.m. Discussion was held on the 45-day requirement by the IDOT, the approval of the ISP, and the availability of police officers. Mr. Gratsiani informed the Council he would pay for the additional cost incurred by the City. Council Member Mahr made a motion to approve the parade request contingent upon law enforcement and a deposit is required prior to the event. Seconded by Moore. Carried 5:0.
- 7. Council Member Engelhardt made a motion to table the **handicap request** until construction is complete by the IDOT. Seconded by Moody. Carried 5:0.
- 8. Council Member Moore made a motion to adopt **Resolution #1422-24**, A Resolution Setting a Date for a Public Hearing for Sale of Property by Bid Process (Quarry Hill). Seconded by Engelhardt. The roll was called ayes: Moore, Mahr, Moody, Engstrom and Engelhardt. Nays: None. Carried 5:0.
- 9. Street Superintendent Dave Imoehl was present to answer any questions regarding upcoming **street project** repairs. Concrete patch on Lybrand two bids were reviewed: Bacon Concrete in the amount of \$9,320 and JJ Concrete in the amount of \$10,500. Street overlay Lybrand/Oak Drive two bids were received Kluesner Construction- \$119,628.60 and River City Paving- \$121,146.10. Council Member Moody made a motion to approve the low bids of Bacon Concrete and Kluesner Construction. Seconded by Engelhardt. Carried 5:0.
- 10. Discussion was held on **tablets** for the City Council to help reduce paper costs. Council directed the clerk to pursue additional pricing for comparative bid.
- 11. Council Member Engstom made a motion to adopt **Resolution #1424-24**, A Resolution of the Mayor and Council of the City of Postville, Iowa Approving the City Council Policies and Procedures Manual. Seconded by Engelhardt. The roll was called ayes: Moore, Mahr, Moody, Engelhardt, and Engstrom. Nays: None. Carried 5:0.
- 12. Council Member Engelhardt made a motion to approve **Resolution #1421-24**, A Resolution Approving the City of Postville Purchasing Policy. Seconded by Mahr. The roll was called ayes: Moore, Mahr, Moody, Engstrom and Engelhardt. Nays: None. Carried 5:0.
- 13. Council Member Moody made a motion to approve a five-year extended warranty with Zieglar Cat for the **generator** at the waste water treatment facility. Seconded by Mahr. Carried 5:0.
- 14. The Council reviewed two bids for 2025 Ford Explorer **police vehicle**. Decorah Ford in the amount of \$49,113 and Karl Ford in the amount of \$44,420. Council Member Moore made a motion to approve the low bid of Karl Ford in the amount of \$44,420. Seconded by Engelhardt. Carried 5:0. The Council reviewed two bids for **vehicle equipment**/ replacement of K-9 cage fittings, body cam and incar dash cams. Council Member Engelhardt made a motion to award the bid for equipment to Sector requiring \$24,900 first year and \$28,850 per year for four years. Seconded by Moore. Carried 5:0.
- 15. Council Member Moody made a motion to allow a request from the Legion to move the **gun safe** from Turner Hall to City Hall. Seconded by Engstrom. Carried 5:0.
- 16. Council Member Engelhardt made a motion to set the public hearing for the **budget amendment FY 24** for April 8. 2024, 7 p.m. Seconded by Mahr. Carried.

- * Waste Water Operator Chris Hackman informed the council it is estimated at least 250,000 gallons of untreated food processing waste from AgriStar's beef-kill operations entered the City of Postville domestic sewer system via a flooded pump station designed to send domestic flows to the City. The effects upon City effluent and operations are as yet to be fully determined, but appear to be significant.
